# Iowa MIECHV Home Visiting Benchmark Measures At-a-Glance

The Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), the funder for the Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program (MIECHV) program, has updated the required benchmark/ performance plan constructs. The below constructs and definitions were chosen by HRSA; the specific assessments utilized are all validated tools selected by Iowa.

The reporting period for the Benchmark Report follows the federal fiscal year (October 1 - September 30). The official Benchmark Report will be pulled from the DAISEY Benchmark Intelligence Report once per year on or after October 15 and will include all families enrolled for one or more days between October 1 and September 30 of that year. All activities and assessments included will also have occurred in this timeframe. As of FY23, all children entered into DAISEY will be considered the target child. Only one target child should be identified per caregiver.
